Bergholz Blaskapelle

The origins of the Bergholz Blaskapelle date back to 1843, when German immigrants in WNY formed a small brass ensemble to preserve the music of their homeland. These settlers, many of them farmers and craftsmen, brought with them a love for Blasmusik—the traditional brass music of Bavaria and the Rhineland.

The first musicians played at church services, weddings, harvest festivals, and community gatherings. Often performing by lantern light in barns or simple halls, they relied on handmade or passed-down instruments. Music became the heartbeat of the community, a source of pride and connection to their German roots in a new land. The band's musical style captured the true essence of a Bavarian Blaskapelle.

During this period, the band began touring extensively across

the United States. They performed in iconic venues such as Rosie O'Grady's Church Street Station in Orlando, Florida, entertained crowds in Balboa Park, San Diego for the San Diego Symphony Oktoberfest, and even played in Hawaii.

The ensemble's musical scores were often sourced directly from Germany, ensuring authenticity. Many members hailed from Bergholz itself—a tiny hamlet settled by German ancestors in 1872 where even today, many streets bear the same family names as the musicians.

The band's dedication to cultural preservation led to several excursions to Germany, including performances in Munich's world-famous Hofbräuhaus, the mecca of German music. This international recognition was a defining moment, connecting the Bergholz musicians directly to the roots of Bavarian Blasmusik,

Today, the Bergholz Blaskapelle thrives as a nonprofit, volunteer-driven organization, comprised of about 30 talented musicians. They continue to perform extensively across Western New York at concerts, parades, Oktoberfest celebrations, and cultural events, carrying on over 180 years of tradition.

The group proudly maintains authentic Bavarian attire, rich German brass harmonies, and the spirit of Gemütlichkeit—warmth, friendliness, and good cheer—that defines true Oktoberfest music. All funds earned are reinvested into instruments, uniforms, sheet music, and educational outreach, ensuring the next generation can inherit this unique cultural treasure.

From lantern-lit barns in 1843 to international stages and modern-day festivals, the Bergholz German Band has carried forth a legacy of music, heritage, and fellowship that continues to unite audiences with the joyful sound of Bavarian brass.



Buffalo Dortmund Sister City Committee

The enduring sister city relationship between Buffalo, New York, and Dortmund, Germany, began in 1972. Official delegations from both cities exchanged visits between 1974 and 1976, laying the groundwork for the formal partnership established on July 4, 1977, in Dortmund.

Rooted in a shared industrial heritage—particularly in steel production—Buffalo and Dortmund also boast a mutual love for football, distinctive beer cultures, and dynamic urban environments that reflect how their industrial pasts have been thoughtfully woven into modern life.

Today, both cities are recognized for their diverse, multicultural communities, thriving start-up ecosystems, and entrepreneurial spirit. Their vibrant music and arts scenes further highlight a rich tapestry of cultural expression and creativity.

A highlight of the partnership is the annual homestay program, where high school students from Dortmund travel to Buffalo from August through December. This exchange has connected generations of families and deepened the bond between the two cities.

Through cultural exchange, economic collaboration, and enduring friendship, the Buffalo— Dortmund sister city relationship continues to grow and inspire meaningful connections across borders.

Many years later we celebrated our 50th concert at the former Elmwood Music Hall. That same year the concert was broadcast on Buffalo's newly established WBEN radio station.

Over the years the chorus has enjoyed two extensive concert tours of Germany and has performed at numerous venues throughout Western New York. We've been delighted to be a guest chorus at Youngstown, OH, Pittsburgh, PA, Midland, Ontario and Toledo, OH. For many years we provided music for a German mass to benefit St. Ann's Roman Catholic Church and Shrine which was formed by German immigrants.

Concordia Foundation Inc.

Formed in 1859, Concordia Cemetery is one of the oldest cemeteries in Western New York and one

of only 4 that still remain in the City of Buffalo. The historic cemetery is listed on both the New York State and National Registers of Historic Places and its buildings are designated Buffalo Landmarks.

Originally it was founded by three German Protestant churches to be shared as their burial ground: the term "concordia" means harmony, and is a reference to the

coming together of the 3 congregations to share this property.

Encompassing 15 acres, the cemetery is the final resting place for thousands of early residents of Buffalo, including over 500 war veterans. There are over 21,000 people of all ethnic backgrounds, cultures and religions reflecting this area's vast diversity at rest here. This includes thousands of Black Americans who came to WNY during the Great Migration.

Staffed entirely by volunteers, this historic site was saved from abandonment in 2003 and relies on donations and grants. The Concordia Foundation, Inc. is a 501-C3 non-profit organization and donations are tax-deductible. Spring Garden Association

A mutual appreciation of the out-of-doors, a desire to share in the peace and beauty of the woods, streams and hills plus the willingness to work and make it all possible is where it began.

In 1938 a group of friends, under the leadership of our first president, Emil Auer, formally requested a Charter from the State of New York. The Charter was granted on April 1, 1938 and the Spring Garden was born. The search began to find a suitable place on which to build the necessary facilities to make Spring Garden a self-supporting enterprise. Finally, our present location was chosen and the



reasons are all too obvious for it contained all the things that were deemed necessary to our wellbeing—a stream winds gently through the wooded hills where the beauties of nature have remained as undisturbed as possible. In short, it answered all the requirements that have been sought.

The ground was cleared and leveled in preparation for our picnic hall. It was a stroke of good fortune that we had the talent that was needed to complete the tasks required. A feverish pace was necessary because even though it seemed impossible, a picnic had been planned for that May 30, 1938 only a short time away.

The Steuben Society Samuel Helm Unit 144

The Steuben Society of America was founded by patriotic Americans of German descent to foster good citizenship in the German-American community, to educate the public as to the positive contributions people of German descent have made to the growth and success of the United States, and to preserve and promote a sense of pride in their German-American heritage. Founded in May 1919 in response to the anti-German sentiment that followed World War I, the society is named after Baron Friedrich Wilhelm von Steuben. A Prussian officer by training, von Steuben was persuaded by Benjamin Franklin to offer his services to the Continental Congress. With the

rank of Major General, Von Steuben's contributions to training the Continental Army at Valley Forge were vital to American victory.

Today, the society has numerous units across the United States. Each individual unit and the national Steuben Society continue the mission of the original founders by organizing and supporting, for example: college scholarships, parades, historic road markers, educational seminars, a bi-monthly publication of The Steuben News and unit meetings.

The Samuel Helm Unit 144, Buffalo, NY was chartered in 2013. Named after Samuel Helm, possibly the first German to settle in Buffalo. He was born in the Palatinate region of Germany arriving in NYS in 1806. He purchased Lot 144 on van Staphorst Street (today approximately 745 Main Street) in 1809 and built a home. Today, a historic street marker, placed by Unit 144 at the approximate site of the Helm house, commemorates our namesake. The Buffalo unit has a monthly Stammtisch where over dinner we celebrate and share our German heritage and is an active member of the Federation of German American Societies of Buffalo & Vicinity.

The Federation of German-American Societies of Buffalo and Vicinity, Inc

The Federation was founded in 1922, in order to promote, develop, maintain, and sustain the fostering of a community of purpose among individuals and clubs formed to celebrate their German-American heritage. Through meetings, promotions, and hosting events, the Federation works to bring a better awareness of the many organizations and their mission to showcase different aspects of the culture, both past and present.
